ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER, NO 6


Now on this \_\_\_\_ day of May, 1997, this matter comes on before the Honorable Larry McClain, Administrative Judge for the Tenth Judicial Court for an order for the destruction of certain court records pursuant to Kansas Supreme Court Rule 108.

The Court is informed by Ramona Allenbrand, Clerk of the District Court, that the records to be destroyed all meet the retention requirements of Kansas Supreme Court Rule 108. The required notice has been given to the Kansas Historical Society and to the Johnson County Archives. A notice of intent to destroy records has been posted in several public locations of the Office of the Clerk of the District Court since August 30, 1996.

Further, the Clerk informs the Court that all records to be destroyed have been microfilmed and indexed into a computerized system by case type, case number, and all participant names. One copy of the microfilm is located in the Johnson County Courthouse for reasonable search and retrieval and one copy is stored with Corporate Records Systems, Bonner Springs, Kansas, a developed under-ground storage facility. Destruction of said court records will be by shredding under a bonded contract with Security Shred of Lenexa, Kansas.

After due consideration, the Court finds that the court records described herein should be destroyed under the direction of the Clerk of the District Court, and that the Clerk will make a return to the Court, which shall include a cumulative description of the records destroyed.
