An Administrative Order  
Regarding Use of the Youth Level of Services/  
Case Management Inventory to Guide  
Level of Probation Supervision

Administrative Order  
No. 16-05

NOW on this 25 day of April, 2016, pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2361, it is ordered that for good cause, the below recommendations be adopted regarding use of the Youth Level of Services/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI) to determine the agency assigned for supervision.

1. The YLS/CMI is a risk/needs assessment and a case management tool that has been adopted by the State of Kansas as evidence-based in the determination of risk for juvenile offenders and can be used post-adjudication for the purpose of a pre-sentence investigation and/or post-sentence community supervision.
2. Court Services shall be responsible for conducting the initial YLS/CMI for all post-adjudication cases. Juveniles determined to be appropriate for community-based supervision shall be sentenced to a term of probation as determined by the YLS/CMI as follows:
  - a. Any juvenile offender with a YLS/CMI score of 20 or above shall be supervised by Community Corrections.
  - b. Any juvenile offender with a YLS/CMI score of 16 or below shall be supervised by Court Services.
  - c. Any juvenile offender with a YLS/CMI score of 17-19 shall fall into a discretionary category wherein Court Services and Community Corrections shall confer to determine the appropriate level of supervision.
  - d. Any juvenile offender determined to have committed an offense which is sexually-motivated shall also receive a Juvenile Sexual Offender Assessment Protocol (J-SOAP), and this score shall be considered in determining appropriate agency of supervision.
  - e. Any juvenile adjudicated for a status offense shall be supervised by Court Services pursuant to the YLS/CMI score.
  - f. If, upon review of the YLS/CMI score and with consideration of the underlying charge, the court finds that the welfare of the child or community safety will be at risk by using the prescribed level of supervision, the court may order the form of supervision necessary to meet the needs of the child and the community.


