ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER No. 2020-17

(Replaces Administrative Order 16-05)

Re: Youth Level of Service/Case Management Inventory – Level of Probation  
Supervision

**Whereas** the Court issued Administrative Order 16-05 regarding the Youth Level of Services/Case Management Inventory (YLS/CMI) on April 26, 2016;

**Whereas** Administrative Order 16-05 requires update and certain provisions rescinded.

The Court hereby supersedes AO 16-05 with this Order.

**NOW** on this 29th day of December, 2020, pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2361, it is ordered that for good cause, the below recommendations be adopted regarding use of the YLS/CMI 2.0 to determine the agency assigned for supervision.

1. The YLS/CMI 2.0 is a risk/needs assessment and a case management tool that has been adopted by the State of Kansas as evidence-based in the determination of risk for juvenile offenders and can be used post-adjudication for the purpose of a pre-sentence investigation and/or post-sentence community supervision.
2. Court Services shall be responsible for conducting the initial YLS/CMI 2.0 for all post-adjudication cases. Juveniles determined to be appropriate for community-based supervision shall be sentenced to a term of probation as determined by the YLS/CMI 2.0 as follows:
  - a. Any juvenile offender with a YLS/CMI 2.0 risk level of HIGH shall be supervised by Community Corrections.
  - b. Any juvenile offender with a YLS/CMI 2.0 risk level of MODERATE shall be supervised by Court Services unless subsection (f) applies.
  - c. Any juvenile offender with a YLS/CMI 2.0 risk level of LOW shall be supervised by Court Services.
  - d. Any juvenile offender determined to have committed an offense which is sexually-motivated shall also receive a Juvenile Sexual Offender Assessment Protocol (J-SOAP), and this score shall be considered in determining appropriate agency supervision.
  - e. Any juvenile adjudicated for a status offense shall be supervised by Court Services pursuant to the YLS/CMI 2.0 score.
  - f. If, upon review of the YLS/CMI 2.0 score and with consideration of the underlying charge, the Court finds that the welfare of the child or community safety will be at risk by using the prescribed level of supervision, the Court may order the form of supervision necessary to

- meet the needs of the child and the community.
3. This Administrative Order will be in effect until the Office of Judicial Administration and the Kansas Department of Corrections set statewide cut-off scores for juvenile offenders.
